#### **Message from the President**

Dear Owners and Residents-

Today I am writing to share some extremely disappointing news with you. Michael Bono, the owner of Bono and Associates, Inc., has given Lake of the Woods HOA a 60-day notice that his company will be terminating its accounting and collection services contract with us effective September 15, 2021. Unfortunately, this termination means that Allen Cresgy, our LCAM, also will be leaving at that time as he was engaged through Bono. Allen's work on behalf of our community has been exceptional since joining LOW in November 2020. His hiring was approved unanimously by the Board at a closed personnel meeting on September 4, 2020. Allen will be sorely missed.

Bono has indicated their decision to terminate this agreement is primarily due to the ongoing harassment they have received from Teresa Straub, one of our Board members. Teresa has chosen not to work with the Board but rather to impugn the Board wherever possible. Her actions are enumerated in a letter from the Board disseminated via Vantaca\* and distributed at the board meeting on July 20th. A resident who spoke at the end of the July board meeting well-articulated this damaging situation. She stated that she likes Teresa Straub and voted for her at the March elections because she thought Teresa had good ideas. Since then, however, she has seen that Teresa has not interacted with the Board and has not worked with the Board. She stated, "that isn't why I voted for you, and I hope you will stop what you are doing and work with the Board."

Unrelated, LOW's roofs have been a topic of discussion in the community. Our roofs are 11-13 years old and are scheduled to be replaced starting in 2024. Although our shingle roofs are technically rated as 40-year roofs, a life span of 20 years is more realistic due to Florida's harsh heat extremes and tropical weather. Some owners have suggested accelerating the roof replacement timeline, but our reserves are not planned around that schedule. We need to consider several factors.

First, it is prudent to optimize our roof investment by making the repairs necessary to make it to the planned 2024 replacement and beyond. However, some insurance companies that want to protect their assets and profits may prefer not to insure homes with shingle roofs over 12 years old. Complying with these companies would require us to replace roofs much sooner than necessary, thereby costing LOW significantly more.

Please be assured that the Board will carefully weigh the advantages and disadvantages of early or scheduled roof replacement after receiving the recommendations of the ad-hoc Reserve Study Committee. We will keep you advised of this discussion in the months ahead.

#### Money Matters—Jo Elmblad

**CPI & Assessment Update:** Per the U.S. Department of Labor's website, using the most recently published June 2021 index, the calculated amount of increase we could have effective next April is \$9.43. Our actual amount will be determined after the September 2021 index is published and we're able to compare that to the September 2020 index.

Balance Sheet and Revenue and Expense Statements, summarized through June 30, 2021 reflect monthly operating Budget of \$114,792.53 vs. Actual expense of \$128,808.22 for the month, a difference of (\$14,015.69.) Now halfway through the year, YTD results reflect Actual Expense of \$678,363.41 compared to Budget of \$688,755.18 for a difference of \$10,391.77. Monthly activity included noting an additional charge of \$1,950 paid to Bono for Vantaca user fees for two people for the June 2020 to June 2021 time period and \$455 for portal monthly charge for that same time period. This will also add \$185 per month to our operating expense from this point forward. Other items of note included receipt of \$1,120 in resident directory advertising income thanks to Terry (TJ) Brown's efforts. Landscape upgrades for the month not associated with building repair/refurb totaled \$3,439 applicable to 12 homes. We updated fire extinguishers at the clubhouse during the month (\$346.28). REW, our new landscape contractor tested and repaired northside irrigation (\$994.75) and will be evaluating and testing the irrigation system for the rest of the community. Tree Maintenance for the month totaled \$8,875. And, regarding tree activity, it appears we'll need to plant approximately 59 trees to satisfy Seminole County arbor guidelines. Proposals are being obtained but estimated expense is in the \$20-\$25K range.

Our AR Aging report as of June 30 showed a Monthly Assessment Receivable total of \$24,537.98 compared to \$24,596.05 for May. Total of Aging Summary for June, which includes Receivables as well as numerous service fees and charges by Bono, was \$32,271.76 compared to \$32,003.22 for May. According to Bono's collection report for the month, we had ten accounts with balance settled, one bankruptcy, one intent to lien, three Pre-intent to lien, 18 reminder notices, and seven accounts with our attorney. The total owed by delinquent accounts controlled by our attorney is \$29,062.09 with the largest account owing \$9,298.68 as of the end of June.

The following summarizes expenses paid from Reserves during the month of June: Landscape upgrade adjustment \$5,763 Building Painting – Meadowood \$15,250 Northside Pump \$6,880 Landscape Upgrade-Meadowood \$4,478

Although next year is months away, we will begin to work on our 2022 budget over this next 30 days. Additionally, the Reserve Study Committee will be developing recommendations affecting our operating and reserve fund budgeting. A final version of next year's budget should be available for the Board's approval at their November meeting.

Lake of the Woods Residents,



- **DO NOT** throw fish scraps in the water or leave them by the shore when fishing.

Please remember that we share the great state of Florida with a very large alligator population and therefore should always utilize caution when enjoying the lake and ALL other community amenities.

#### **Good Pet-iquette—By Alycia Capers**


It's pretty safe to say that LOW is a community full of pets. Dogs, cats, birds, lizards, you name it; we've got it. We know you love your pets—that's not up for debate. The real question is how do your neighbors feel about your pet? Do they love the way you and your pet interact with them and the rest of the community? You may be wondering why that should

be important to you. Keep in mind that creating and maintaining a truly pet friendly environment that welcomes and invests in animals can only happen where there is understanding and harmony between neighbors. It would be hard to persuade a person to buy-in on a dog park or waste stations when they feel pet owners will let their dogs roam off leash regardless of location or not pick up after their dogs no matter how many stations were provided. That being said, here are some tips to encourage everyone to do their part in maintaining our pet friendly LOW community.

#### Learn, Live, and Love the Leash

Unless your dog is secured inside your home or behind a fence, your dog must be on a leash. And that doesn't mean the leash is connected to your dog's collar while dragging on the ground freely. That means, your dog is on the leash with you securing the other end. Leash-

ing your dog sends the message that you respect your neighbors and your community. Leashed dogs are less likely to injure someone/something, become injured themselves or get lost. Leashing is for everyone's safety, especially your cuddly canine's.



It's all about consent! If a neighbor approaches you and asks to meet your dog and your dog enjoys meeting new people, go for it! Likewise, always get consent before allowing your dog to interact with adults, children, or other dogs. When allowing your dog to interact with others, especially children, it's good to remind them of your dog's boundaries. Show them how to pet

or play with your dog. When approaching other dogs, it's best to avoid any rough-housing. Try to encourage only gentle greetings like sniffing. If you notice your dog becoming uncomfortable with any interaction, it is okay to say no. Dogs are people, too, and anyone can have a "Ruff" day.

#### **Scoop the Poop**

Not cleaning up after your pet is the quickest way to give all pet owners in the neighborhood a bad reputation. Being a pet owner is a major responsibility that is accompanied by the expectation that you are willing and able to clean up after your favorite four-legged friend come rain, sleet, or snow; no excuses. Create good habits by carrying bags and using them



anytime you and your dog leave the house. Also, be considerate of where you walk your dog in the neighborhood. Don't allow your dog to walk right up to a neighbor's gate or flower bed to do it's business. Stick to common/unplanted grassy areas on curbsides or sidewalks. These areas are not to be confused with the LOW playground area where pets are NOT permitted.

Remember, a pet friendly neighborhood is more rewarding when everyone works together to keep the peace.


