Thank you to all of you for the past 3 months. Getting to know your community and the many projects needing to be addressed has been quite the adventure. We are slowly but surely getting caught up from the transition and with ongoing projects, and your patience has been and is greatly appreciated.

A huge accomplishment is that we now have a fully staffed office. Thank you goes to Pamela Fendley, Ann Honbarrier, and Terri Straub for the countless hours invested into the staffing project.

Irrigation repairs are in progress and REW Landscape is two-thirds through the valve locating. They have completed many repairs while tracking the valves, and more are no doubt to come. You will be seeing them on site every day until the system is up and running in all locations. Many administrative tasks have been accomplished in the past month, and in the next few months focus will be on landscaping and repairs, such as the retention wall, erosion, storm water drain lines, and the card access system. In addition, hiring of one more maintenance person and updating the website will continue.

# Trash and Recycling Pick up Information

- Regular trash will be picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays.
- Recycling is picked up every Tuesday. You can contact Seminole County, 407-665-2260 to request recycle bins.
- Aluminum cans **ONLY** are picked up every Tuesday by the LOW Can-Can Committee. Be sure to separate your aluminum cans from other recycling if you wish to have them collected by the Can-can Committee.
- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays.

# **Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information**

- Must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled, the bulk item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. the day prior to the scheduled pick up time.
- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on the scheduled day, the bulk item(s) must be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.



No trash or bulk item(s) should be put out prior to 6 p.m. The day before pick up.

## Money Matters—Jo Elmblad

Welcome 2022! May it be a better year for all of us. We're more than ready to return to a more normal routine.

A new year comes with a new budget and new and continuing challenges. As documented previously, our monthly assessment fee will change effective April 1, 2022. That new monthly amount will be \$226.76. Don't forget to update your payment option with the new amount when appropriate.

Included in the approved 2022 budget is an increase in funds dedicated to our Reserves. Reserve Fund allocations for 2022 will total \$480,600 compared to \$417,725 that we're contributing in 2021. We'll be putting approximately 33.6% of our assessment income into our reserve accounts in 2022. Why the significant increase? Unless you live under a rock, you've probably heard about our roof replacement concerns and our efforts to determine where we are from both a time and money perspective in replacing our roofs. As a reminder, our roofs were replaced in 2006-2010 for approximately \$4.6 million.

COVID continues to impact us to some extent as we attempt to get staffing and activity back to normal. This is our second month of information now provided by Andersen Management Services. Though reports received provide essentially the same info we've had previously, the format is different. The Finance Committee is suggesting several possible modification or additions to reports to make them easier to review. Additionally, classification of some of the expenses needs review and revision to be consistent with our history.

Reports reviewed include Balance Sheet, Budget vs. Actuals, Transaction by Detail, Delinquent Owners, and Unpaid Bills by Property, summarized as of November 30, 2021. Review of our Balance Sheet confirmed a nice increase to our Roof Reserve fund with transfer of a \$52,262 maturing CD to it plus our regular monthly allocation of \$21,560.

Our Assessments Receivable total as of November 30<sup>th</sup> was \$28,612.58 compared to \$32,884.23 at the end of October. We do have one large delinquency which should be resolved soon (\$11,042.98).though it's likely we won't recover that full amount due to statute limitations.

A few notable operating expenses for November include Palm tree trimming for \$24,800 which helped put us over budget by \$23,633 for Tree Maintenance YTD; We hired temporary help during the month to help cover Rec hours(\$1,546.37); Spent \$1,371.35 for irrigation repair by REW; Bought new batteries for our two trucks; hired 2 new Rec employees and 1 Admin staff person.

Looking ahead to 2022, I'd like to acknowledge those in our community who serve on our various committees, the Board of Directors, and of course our staff to help make Lake of the Woods a pleasant and attractive place to live. If you'd like to be a part of the decision making process or just be better informed about our community, join a committee, and attend our social, committee and board meetings. If you'd really like to be more involved, throw your hat in the ring to become a board member.

Creating and maintaining a truly pet friendly environment that welcomes animals can only happen where there is understanding and agreement between neighbors. It has not gone unnoticed that some residents are in violation of LOW Rules and Regulations regarding their pets. It has not gone unnoticed that some residents are in violation of Florida leash laws as

well. These residents put themselves at risk of receiving not only violation letters but fines as well. That being said, here are some reminders and tips to encourage everyone to do their part in maintaining a pet friendly LOW community.

#### Learn, Live, and Love the Leash

Unless your dog is secured inside your home or behind a fence, your dog MUST be on a leash. And that doesn't mean the leash is connected to your dog's collar while dragging on the ground freely. That means, your dog is on the leash with you securing the other end. Leashing your dog sends the message that you respect your neighbors and your community. Leashed dogs are less likely to injure someone/something, become injured themselves or get lost. Leashing is for everyone's safety, especially your cuddly canine's.



#### **Govern the Greetings**



Always get consent before approaching someone else's dog. Likewise, always get consent before allowing your dog to approach others. When allowing your dog to interact with others, especially children, it's good to remind them of your dog's boundaries. Show them how to pet or play with your dog. When interacting with other dogs, it's best to avoid any rough-housing. Try to encourage only gentle greetings like sniffing. If your dog becomes uncomfortable with any interaction, it is okay to say no. Dogs are people, too, and anyone can have a "Ruff" day.

#### **Scoop the Poop**

Not cleaning up after your pet is the quickest way to give all pet owners in the neighborhood a bad reputation. Being a pet owner is a major responsibility that is accompanied by the expectation that you are willing and able to clean up after your favorite four-legged friend come rain, sleet, or snow; no excuses. Create good habits by carrying bags and using them anytime you and your dog leave the house. Also, be considerate of where you walk your dog in the neighbor-

help! We need volunteers willing to dedicate two to three hours on Tuesday mornings to help collect cans throughout the community.




#### U.S. FLAG RETIREMENT EVENT

# **Donate to English Estates Elementary School**




