Thank you to all the Board/Committee/ and all members that attended the 6/20/23 Board Meeting. Updates:

Re-Roof project: BFARR has been selected as the Vendor of choice - Timing/phasing are some of the negotiations in process.

Water Intrusion: The engineer, is coordinating a meeting with the Board in July

<u>Palm Tree trimming</u>- Platinum Landscape will be assigning 1 day a week to trim palms (weather permitting) starting within the next couple of weeks.

<u>Street Drain</u> – DRS, who has previously worked on some of the drains, is in the process of providing a proposal, once received I will seek comparable proposals to present to the Board.

Owners- please double checking your assessment payments to ensure you are paying the correct amount to be processed before the 10^{th} to prevent any fees or interest, this is the owner's responsibility.

Collection Policy for Lake of the Woods, HOA

Monthly Assessments are due on the 1st of every month.

- 1. Association assessment fees are due on the first of every month and must be received no later than the 10th of each month. If payment is not received within 10 days of the due date, a \$25 late fee, interest of 6% annum plus any collection fees will be charged and a notice of late assessment will be mailed to all known addresses on record.
- 2. If payment is not received within 40 days of due date, a 45- day Intent to Lien notice along with any collection charges for such notice shall be sent to owner. According to Florida Statute, letter should be sent both certified mail and regular mail to all known addresses at the time of processing.
- 3. If assessment is unpaid after the 45-day Intent to Lien Notice expires, the account shall be forwarded to the Attorney requesting the lien to be placed, and any further collection cost will be added to owner's account. The Board will review and execute the lien and Management will return it to the association's attorney. This is when the assessment is approximately 85 days past due.
- 4. Once the lien is recorded, a 45-day Intent to Foreclose letter is sent to the owner from the collections' Attorney.
- 5. If the owner does not pay prior to this 45-day expiration the manager will review the matter with the Board to determine if the Board wants to proceed with foreclosing on the property.
- 6. Board Policy is automatic approval for management to proceed with collections as outlined above, and lien foreclosure actions up to the actual filing of foreclosure.

Collection Policy Approved by the Board of Directors on 2-21-2023 at a Duly Noted Board Meeting.



MONEY MATTERS - Jo Emblad

Financial reports, summarized through May 31, 2023 indicate monthly Actual expense of \$129,587.10 vs Budget of \$133,177.32 for a difference of \$3,590.22. YTD figures show Actual expense of \$612,324.04 vs. Budget of \$665,886.60 for a difference of \$53.562.56.

Irrigation repair expense, noted consistently as a concern over this past year was \$6,922 for the month of May and \$27,022 YTD. Originally the 2023 annual budget for irrigation was \$25,000 but the Board did approve upping that budget amount to \$35,000 at its April meeting. However, that's not going to carry us much farther into the year when our monthly expense is in the \$3-\$5K range and we're already at \$27K.

(Reminder: Our 2023 budget includes \$33,547 in income from Prior Year's Surplus as we did not have enough assessment income to balance the budget. Because the board approved adding \$10,000 to irrigation budget the income amount from Prior Year's Surplus should be \$43,547. This affects actual vs budget comparisons as we show more budget available but no direct offsetting expense.)

Our Balance sheet includes 3 operating account CD's, totaling approximately \$233,539 maturing in the next two months. Fees due to Premier Management for the month totaled \$1,350 compared to \$2,950 for April. Late fees totaled \$1,429.19.

Accounts Receivable total as of May 31st was \$44,442.64 compared to \$45,310.01.56 at the end of April. May's summary report showed 56 owners delinquent compared to 73 in March. Our largest delinquent account owes \$16,884.90 as of May 31. Actual delinquent assessment total was \$38,613.78. The difference between that total and the \$44,442.64 AR total is fees and charges to be paid to Premier. Those additional fees are charged back to owners ledger. An explanation of our collection policy was included in June's LOWHAN. Additional notification(\$10) and collection (\$100) fees are also part of that policy. For historical comparison, our Accounts Receivable total at the end of **May 2022** was \$29,252.86 on our Balance Sheet and our largest delinquent account owed \$13,123.43, approximately half of the AR total at that time.

In an effort to save printing costs, the August LOWHAN will be available online and paper copies will **not** be delivered to all residents. As explained in the June issue, if you want a paper copy to be delivered, contact the office. So far, approximately 50 owners have asked for printed paper copies. Did you know that printing our newsletter each month uses approximately 75% of our copying allowance each month? We pay an extra charge when we exceed our monthly allowance of 8500 copies. Printing a 12 page newsletter produces 6,396 copies. Our Printing/Copying expense totals \$2,646.55 YTD vs. ANNUAL budget of \$3,000 so we're likely to be over budget in this category in the next month or two as our monthly expense is in the \$275-\$350 range.

Expect to see tree maintenance activity within the next month to help us get through hurricane season without big tree problems. Proposals are presumably in hand. The same is supposed to be true for the first wave of water retention remedial action proposals.

The community anxiously awaits updated info on roof replacement and water intrusion activity.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of May 31, 2023 were Capital \$210,499.47; R&R \$778,405.80; and Roof \$2,818,276.62.



2022 Event Accomplishments

TRASH AND RECYCLING PICK UP INFORMATION

- Regular trash will be picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays.
- Recycling is picked up every Friday. You can contact Seminole County, 407-665-2260 to request recycle bins.
- Aluminum cans **ONLY** are picked up every Friday by the LOW Can-Can Committee.
- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays. (Debris must be in a container or tied in a bundle.

Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information

- Appliances and electronic waste must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled for white goods/electronic waste, these item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. on Thursdays. Regular bulk items do not require advanced scheduling to be picked up.
- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on Friday, the bulk item(s) **must** be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.

No trash or bulk item(s) can be put out prior to 6p.m. the day before pick up.



RECYCLING COMMITTEE - NEW TIME: 7:30AM FRIDAYS

Please place all separated aluminum cans near your garage door/carport, or sidewalk for collection by the Can-Can Volunteers. Also as the recycling truck is now arriving in our neighborhood earlier than in the past, our volunteers will be starting at 7:30am on recycle days.

The "Can-Can" Committee still needs volunteers willing to dedicate two to three hours once a month on a Friday morning at 7:30am to help collect cans throughout the community. SANDLESS SANDBAGS?

Following Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, research was conducted to identify an alternative to traditional sandbags to protect Lake of the Woods Townhomes from flood waters. Five sandless sandbags (dams) have been identified, but only three appear suitable to provide abatement of flood waters threatening residences: The three sandless sandbags are:

QUICK DAM: a self-activating patented gel barrier, tubelike height of 3-4", width 8", comes in various lengths, www.quickdams.com; QUICK DAM: 888-761-4405.

HYDRABARRIER: water fill barrier, tubelike height 3-4", width 8" comes in various lengths, www.hydrabarrier.com; WATERSHED INNOVATIONS: 888-876-4068.

PIG HOME SOLUTIONS: water fill barrier, tubelike; height 3-5", width 8", lengths vary, www.newpig.com, NEW PIG: 855-493-HOGS.

All prices vary with length from \$21.99 to \$100.00 and are available at/through Lowe's, Home Depot, COSTCO, ACE, and Amazon.

There are many reviews of successes and a few failures of these sandless sandbags on individual websites and on Amazon. While the use of these 'dams' appears better than traditional sandbags they may not always be successful as described in the various failures.



PARKING! DID YOU KNOW?

- Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot.
- Parking from 2AM -7AM requires a permit. Go to LOW website: (www.lakeofthewoodshoa.com) to fill out form.
- Speed limit is 15MPH
- At the end of your driveway is a flat curb called a "ribbon." The ribbon is not part of the driveway, and therefore, vehicles must be fully in the driveway and not over the ribbon.
- Trailers are prohibited in driveways, unless actively being loaded or unloaded. All unattached trailers must otherwise be parked at the rear of the Clubhouse lot, with a permit, if parking overnight.

The Latest Updates on Roofing and Water Intrusion Projects

During the June meeting, the Board committed to delivering the latest updates on our two largest projects. While details are still coming together and we are still working very hard to finalize the items necessary to move forward, the latest updates on these two projects are below. Thank you for your patience and continued support in these endeavors, and we look forward to providing more updated details as they become available.

Re-Roofing Update

- The Board is in the final steps of confirming roofing details like shingle colors, the number of tiles, and the final strategy for replacing roofs.
- The Board will likely move forward in three phases, dependent on financing. Once financing is finalized, we will share a list of which buildings will be in each phase, as prioritized by our roofing consultant, Allied.
- Financing will likely include a combination of Roofing Reserves and a bank loan, paid for by a special assessment. The procedures necessary to determine and enact any special assessment will begin once the final amounts and loan information become available.
- To ensure the most professional execution of the process, our CAM is currently securing financial and legal professional guidance, as well as the necessary documents, for loan and special assessment procedures.

Water Intrusion Update

- The Board has received and reviewed the Engineer's surveys and several bids.
- The original list of affected addresses included only reports submitted prior to Hurricane lan;
 - o The Board understands additional units and areas, including units on Woodridge and the area behind the tennis courts, are experiencing water pooling and intrusion after the hurricane.
 - o The CAM is obtaining additional surveys and bids for these areas.
- Two Board Directors and the Manager will meet with the Engineer on Friday, July 7'h, 2023.
- A public Board meeting with the Engineer, in which community questions will be answered, is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday, July 11th at the LOW Clubhouse at 7:00pm
 - o We will be using a moderator to facilitate answering community questions.
 - o An agenda and additional information will be posted next week.
 - o **All** questions **must** be submitted in advance.

- Due to the cost of this project, it will likely be completed in phases. The Board hopes to have a
 prioritized list of affected properties and locations, start date and more information available
 before the regularly scheduled July meeting.
- Note that the Water Intrusion project does not include street dra1ns, but the office has been tasked to solicit bids for street drain cleaning and maintenance. The maintenance team does check the street drain grates daily for debris.
