The materials available have been scarce and hard to come by; this will lead to rising costs for roof replacement. 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CAM CORNER/MANAGER'S REPORT

Great news!!! The Access Card System has been completed!!!

Please know that as of July 18, 2022, you will need an access card to enter the clubhouse. One card per property is available for pickup at the front office Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Please bring a photo ID when you pick up your card and allow 5 to

10 minutes for programming. Cards will be associated with you and your property, allowing us to track who is coming and going. If you are a tenant, please bring a copy of your lease and obtain the owner's/your land-lord's written permission to receive the card as only one card is provided free of charge. Cards provided to tenants will be programmed to expire when your lease expires, so please remember to come by the office with your lease renewal to keep the card active. Additional cards will be available for purchase once the price has been determined.

You will soon be receiving a recall of Director mailing. Ms. Straub was requested to step down from the board but requested that the members vote. As such, a ballot will be sent to you for your vote in this matter, and the ballot will be available at the office as well. Please take a moment to complete and return the ballot to make your vote count. Thank you!

The new landscape company, Creative Edge Lawn & Landscape, will start its services on July 5, 2022, and they will be on-site four days per week, Monday – Thursday. Irrigation repairs were started on June 27, 2022, and we are hopeful that we will soon have a fully functioning irrigation system and a pristine-looking community.

It has been a pleasure providing you with management services for the past nine months. As I write this article, the renewal vote for my contract has not taken place. So, when you receive this newsletter, I either thank you for the opportunity to continue to provide you with management services, or I thank you for the time we have had together. Either way, I am grateful for having had the opportunity to meet so many of you, and I wish you all the best in the future!

TRASH AND RECYCLING PICK UP INFORMATION

- Regular trash will be picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays.
- Recycling is now picked up every Friday. You can contact Seminole County, 407-665-2260 to request recycle bins.
- Aluminum cans **ONLY** are picked up every Friday by the LOW Can-Can Committee. Be sure to separate your aluminum cans from other recycling if you wish to have them collected by the Can-can Committee.
- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays.

Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information

- Must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled, the bulk item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. the day prior to the scheduled pick up time.
- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on the scheduled day, the bulk item(s) must be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.

No trash or bulk item(s) can be put out prior to 6p.m. the day before pick up.





MONEY MATTERS—JO ELMBLAD

Financial reports summarized through May 31, 2022, indicated a monthly Actual expense of \$112,871.78 vs Budget of \$120,025.75 for a difference of \$7,153.97. YTD figures showed Actual expense of \$544,876.191 vs. Budget of \$600,128.74 for a difference of \$55,252.55. Following the same pattern as the last few months, we are under Budget primarily due to Maintenance staff payroll (-\$26,869.29) and Grounds Maintenance (-\$15,012.08) expenses being less than budgeted.

As noted previously, we are over Budget in Employment Screening for the month and the year, with a Budget of \$300 for the year and Actual expense YTD at \$3,254.62. This expense category includes employment ad expense and background and drug test expense. Adequate and affordable staffing continues to be a significant challenge.

Irrigation repair expense for May totaled \$5,681.96 vs. Budget of \$1,666.67, which also included the renewal of the annual Hoover pump maintenance contract at \$2,590. We are also over budget YTD in this category. We are again having problems with a well pump on our north side, and repair/replacement efforts are underway. We'll have a new landscape contractor on-site beginning July 1. The new contract's annual cost of \$212,657.40 calculates to \$18,466.84 monthly. That compares to our monthly expense of \$15,875 for REW's service, which terminated on June 1. The difference is \$2,591.84 per month or \$31,102.05 annually. That means we need to find an additional \$31K in the Budget for our landscape contract in 2023.

And speaking of next year's Budget, a comparison of the CPI using May's 2022 indicator calculates a monthly assessment increase of \$14.86 (6.6% increase, \$81K additional income.) It's likely that the September indicator will be higher, and we could see something as high as a 9-10% increase. Several HOA webcasts and bulletins regarding budget planning for 2023 suggest a 10-15% increase will be needed next year just to keep on with existing services.

Our Accounts Receivable total at the end of May was \$29,252.86 on our Balance Sheet compared to April's month-end total of \$26,323.79. Our largest delinquent account now owes \$13,123.43, almost half of our AR total.

Looking for areas where we might be able to save some money, did you know that printing our newsletter each month uses approximately 75% of our copying allowance each month? We pay an extra charge when we exceed our monthly allowance of 8500 copies. In May, we paid \$525.87 for excess copies. Per our contract, we are billed quarterly for any usage above a 3-month allowance of 25,500. At cost of .006 per copy, this calculates to 87,645 copies over our allowance. We currently send the newsletter out via email. If we printed a small number of copies to be available at the office for pick up, could we rely on email distribution and discontinue the mass printing of the newsletter for the community?

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of May 31, 2022, were Capital \$187,188.29; R&R \$805,013.05; and Roof \$2,448,650.86.

Development of roof replacement specs is continuing, with special attention to how we can make our flat roofs sloped to accommodate proper drainage. Trying to determine what's acceptable and what's available is a tedious process currently, with supply chain and labor shortages impacting the data gathering process.

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10 INSECT-REPELLING PLANTS THAT ARE KNOWN TO KEEP THE BUGS AWAY—BY AMBER KANUCKEL/ FARMERS ALMANAC

Here's a quick list of some of the plants that are revered for their insect-repelling properties.

1. Lavender: Not only is lavender beautiful and fragrant, but it is known to repel mosquitoes, fleas, flies, and moths.

2. Basil: While we all love the smell of basil, mosquitoes, moths, and flies are not fans. Use bail to repel flies and moths in your garden, crush leaves and rub on your skin while working in the garden to keep mosquitoes off you.

3. Thyme: This plant comes in wide varieties and makes a wonderful ground cover for dry, rocky areas. Thyme will also help keep mosquitoes away from your gardens.

4. Mint: Mint is another mosquito repellent, but one that you should use with care because it spreads aggressively and may take over a planting. Plant it in pots and place it near doorways.

5. Lemongrass: This beautiful grassy plant is packed with citronella, which is one of the best-known alternatives to synthetic repellents like DEET. Crush the leaves and rub them on the skin (test a small area first.)

6. Alliums: This member of the onion family is known for tall spikes that produce gigantic balls of purple flowers (although there are also smaller varieties.) Alliums are one of the best defenses against a variety of pests, including cabbage worms, aphids, carrot flies, and slugs, as they dislike the smell.

7. Chrysanthemums: Use these flowers as a border planting around your home to keep out bedbugs, fleas, lice, roaches, ants, and more. These plants contain naturally occurring pyrethrin, an insecticide. They repel ticks, spider mites, Japanese beetles, and other garden pests.

8. Petunias: Known for their many colors and a profusion of flowers, petunias help repel leafhoppers, squash bugs, tomato hornworms, and aphids—simply plant near brassicas (cruciferous veggies), beans, basil, tomatoes, grapes, corn, and peppers. Roses also do well when this natural insect deterrent is planted nearby.

9. Marigolds: The marigold is one of the most well-known insect-repelling plants, and with good reason they have a scent that will keep pests like mosquitoes, nematodes like cabbage worms, and other pests away. Plant marigolds to attract beneficial insects that attack and kill aphids. Ladybugs are especially fond of aphids.

10. Mosquito Plant/Citronella: Mosquito Plant (citrosa geraniums or Pelargonium citrosum) is an attractive tropical plant with lacy green foliage and beautiful flowers. It's a member of the geranium family. It is prized for its citrus aroma that comes from the oils in the foliage. They're certainly beautiful plants to grow in the backyard, but if you're planting them because of the promise of fewer bugs flying around your yard, you'll have to crush the leaves to obtain any bug-repelling properties. Unfortunately, the effects are not very longlasting—only for about 30 minutes.

Pest-repelling plants can be both fragrant and beautiful. Try planting a few of these in your garden to keep the bug population in check.

• Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot.

- Parking from 2AM -7AM requires a permit
- Speed limit is 15MPH

• At the end of your driveway is a flat curb called a "ribbon." The ribbon is not part of the driveway, and therefore, vehicles must be fully in the driveway and not over the ribbon.

• Trailers are prohibited in driveways, unless actively being loaded or unloaded. All unattached trailers must otherwise be parked at the rear of the Clubhouse lot, with a permit, if parking overnight.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH THIS PICTURE? <u>PARKING VIOLATION</u>

The HOA is actively issuing violation notices. Parking into the street or parking outside of any perimeter of a driveway is a common and frequent violation. All vehicles and all parts of a vehicle (including bumper and trailer hitch) must be completely contained within a driveway. Many residents are unaware that driveways end at the 'ribbon.' The ribbon (some call it a 'flat curb') is actually part of

the street, <u>NOT</u> part of the driveway. In the photo above, the vehicle is about 15" past the property line - truck, bumper, and hitch are all extending over the 'ribbon' and into the street. **It's a violation!**
