Another month has come and gone, and Central Florida is moving into summertime. We've seen a lot of developments in Lake of the Woods over the past few months, and there are a lot of updates to share!

The roofing project is starting to pick up speed. In May, we agreed to begin contract negotiations with BFARR, the same roofing contractor who has already repaired several of the flat roofs throughout our community. While contract negotiations are underway, we continue to evaluate financing options and are exploring all possible resources. We want to minimize the impact on our residents as much as possible, and I'm very thankful for the work of our treasurer, Lauretta Lumkes, other volunteers, and Premier Management who are working hard to thoroughly consider every possible solution.

Our other major project, addressing water intrusion issues in several properties throughout Lake of the Woods, is also getting a lot of attention. With the Central Florida rainy season fully underway, the Board is acutely aware of the urgency with which we need to address these issues. While we don't have sufficient information to move forward with the project as a whole, we hope to see activity on the most severely impacted properties in the coming weeks.

On a very positive note, I'm very happy to say that our monthly Board meetings are running more smoothly than ever before. More owners are showing more courtesy and understanding toward one another, and business gets done with efficiency. If you haven't been attending our monthly meetings—held the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 PM–I would like to invite you to come to our June meeting and see how your Board works to keep Lake of the Woods a beautiful place to live. You may even find yourself getting involved!

Finally, we will soon change the LOWAN to a primarily digital distribution; this format saves money and makes it easier for our owners to stay up to date from anywhere. **Don't worry, though!** If you prefer to get a print edition delivered to your home as you do now, we will have a process to register so you can enjoy uninterrupted delivery.

### **Collection Policy**

### for Lake of the Woods, HOA

Monthly Assessments are due on the 1st of every month.

- 1. Association assessment fees are due on the first of every month and must be received no later than the 10th of each month. If payment is not received within 10 days of the due date, a \$25 late fee, interest of 6% annum plus any collection fees will be charged and a notice of late assessment will be mailed to all known addresses on record.
- 2. If payment is not received within 40 days of due date, a 45- day Intent to Lien notice along with any collection charges for such notice shall be sent to owner. According to Florida Statute, letter should be sent both certified mail and regular mail to all known addresses at the time of processing.
- 3. If assessment is unpaid after the 45-day Intent to Lien Notice expires, the account shall be forwarded to the Attorney requesting the lien to be placed, and any further collection cost will be added to owner's account. The Board will review and execute the lien and Management will return it to the association's attorney. This is when the assessment is approximately 85 days past due.
- 4. Once the lien is recorded, a 45-day Intent to Foreclose letter is sent to the owner from the collections' Attorney.
- 5. If the owner does not pay prior to this 45-day expiration the manager will review the matter with the Board to determine if the Board wants to proceed with foreclosing on the property.
- 6. Board Policy is automatic approval for management to proceed with collections as outlined above, and lien foreclosure actions up to the actual filing of foreclosure.

### **MONEY MATTERS - Jo Emblad**

According to our financial statements summarized as of April 30, 2023 our Revenue & Expense Report for the month reflects Actual expense of \$117,000.37 vs Budget of \$133,177.32 for a difference of \$16,176.95. YTD figures show Actual expense of \$482,736.94 vs. Budget of \$532,709.28 for a difference of \$49,972.34. Expense categories under budget include Employee Insurance -\$5,261.94; Legal Expense -\$4,610.18; Maintenance Payroll -\$11,951.76; Roof Repairs -\$4,533.32; Maintenance Repairs/Supplies -\$5,521.93; Tree Maintenance -\$15,470; and Clubhouse Contract Services -\$4,423.75. Irrigation repair expense continues to climb though totaling \$20,100 through April. As noted last month, the Board approved increasing the irrigation annual budget to \$35,000 but that's not going to get us through the year. Other categories over budget include Copies & Printing +\$1,439.87; Gutters +\$3,428.68; clubhouse expense +\$7,742.10 and Irrigation repair +\$11,766.68.

Balance Sheet total for Accounts Receivable at the end of April was \$45,310.01. Assessments receivable portion of that total was \$39,224.34 for 73 delinquent accounts. The difference between those two totals is what we're paying for late fees, notification and collection fees, interest, legal fees, returned checks, etc.

If you'd like to see more monthly summary financial info for yourself, you can view reports on Premier's portal.

Once you've signed in, select Documents, then Financials. You'll choose 2022 or 2023 info. Select the year and then the month of info you'd like to see. Balance Sheet & Revenue & Expense reports are viewable and printable.

Water intrusion repair proposals have been received and will be reviewed and evaluated by Building & Grounds Committee. A meeting for the community with the engineer involved in developing the scope of water intrusion repairs will be scheduled in the near future.

At its May meeting, the Board approved electrical repair work to be done in the pool pump room for \$2,322. Proposals to upgrade our clubhouse network are being evaluated. Significant tree maintenance is being planned to help us survive hurricane season too. Bids are in process.

In an effort to reduce printing expense, the July LOWHAN will not be printed and delivered to your mail-box. Instead the newsletter will be available and viewable on the Lake of the Woods HOA website. If you want to continue to receive a paper copy, you'll have an opportunity to request that from the office.

Progress on the reroofing project includes the Board's decision to begin contract negotiation with BFARR Roofing.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of April 30, 2023 were Capital \$208,487.83; R&R \$759,186.08; and Roof

\$2,784,189.84. Each month we add to our Reserve Funds contributing approximately 33% of our assessment income. Monthly allocations are \$1,816.67 to Capital; \$17,275 to R&R; and \$24,333.33 to Roof. So, each month, we add a total of \$173,699.97 to our reserves.

### DONATE TO ENGLISH ESTATES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Last month we stuffed the bus, but we can't stop now! Let's get into overdrive, these teachers and students need supplies. Everything from paper, pencils, crayons, pens, to glue, books, backpacks and more. Any donations would help these teachers who often buy supplies with their own money because most of the students at English Estates aren't able to provide their own.

There is also a huge need for food. The kids are sent home on Fridays with groceries for the weekend so they don't have to go to bed hungry. We can help with that too! We have a school bus donation box in the lobby of the Clubhouse. Please help us stuff this bus with food and school supplies for these children in need.



### Here comes Summer!!

OK – let's get ready. Summer is coming and with it (maybe) some changes. The last 3 years have been La Nina years. This year we may transition quickly to an El Nino year. What does that mean for us and our leaf babies. Well, maybe more rain and fewer intense hurricanes. Believe the rain, but all it takes is one hurricane to change your life, so get ready.

If LOW gets more rain, a difference this year will be that the irrigation will be driven by rain events. As it happens, Florida has a law that requires automatic irrigation systems to monitor rain and not operate irrigation when rain occurs. When the southside irrigation LOW pumps were repaired after Ian last year, the rain sensors were activated to comply with this. So, in wet weather, you may not see your irrigation running on its normal schedule.

In the current survey of the irrigation system, we have noticed that some settings on the irrigation clocks have been changed by persons unknown. Please don't do this! Changes to watering schedules need to be coordinated with the operation of the pumps.

Hot weather will stress your leaf babies (and you too)! Heat in addition to fertilizer and late pruning can be devastating to plants. Light pruning can be done on some summer bloomers like hibiscus, oleander, and crepe myrtle, but azalea pruning can only be done for a couple of more weeks.

The Seminole County fertilizer restrictions kick in as of June 1, but should not affect most patio gardeners. But, for the record, "summer blend" (no nitrogen and no phosphorus) potassium with micro-nutrient mixes are mandated to try to keep our lakes from algae blooms. It might seem picky-picky but every time it rains, phosphorus from fertilizer gets washed into our lakes contributing to algae blooms and degraded water quality.

\* Mowing depends on condition of grass, if grass is too dry or not growing, other work will be performed on property.

#### TRASH AND RECYCLING PICK UP INFORMATION

- Regular trash will be picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays.
- Recycling is now picked up every Friday. You can contact Seminole County, 407-665-2260 to request recycle bins.
- Aluminum cans **ONLY** are picked up every Friday by the LOW Can-Can Committee. Be sure to separate your aluminum cans from other recycling if you wish to have them collected by the Can-can Committee.
- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays. **Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information**

- White goods and electronic waste must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled for white goods/electronic waste, these item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. on Thursdays. Regular bulk items do not require advanced scheduling to be picked up.
- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on Friday, the bulk item(s) must be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.

No trash or bulk item(s) can be put out prior to 6p.m. the day before pick up.



### **RECYCLING COMMITTEE - NEW TIME: 7:30AM FRIDAYS**

Please place all separated aluminum cans near your garage door/carport, or sidewalk for collection by the Can-Can Volunteers. Also as the recycling truck is now arriving in our neighborhood earlier than in the past, our volunteers will be starting at 7:30am on recycle days.

The "Can-Can" Committee still needs volunteers willing to dedicate two to three hours once a month on a Friday morning at 7:30am to help collect cans throughout the community. #### **SANDLESS SANDBAGS?**

Following Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, research was conducted to identify an alternative to traditional sandbags to protect Lake of the Woods Townhomes from flood waters. Five sandless sandbags (dams) have been identified, but only three appear suitable to provide abatement of flood waters threatening residences: The three sandless sandbags are:

OUICK DAM: a self-activating patented gel barrier, tubelike height of 3-4", width 8", comes in various lengths, www.quickdams.com; QUICK DAM: 888-761-4405.

HYDRABARRIER: water fill barrier, tubelike height 3-4", width 8" comes in various lengths, www.hydrabarrier.com; WATERSHED INNOVATIONS: 888-876-4068.

PIG HOME SOLUTIONS: water fill barrier, tubelike; height 3-5", width 8", lengths vary, www.newpig.com, NEW PIG: 855-493-HOGS.

All prices vary with length from \$21.99 to \$100.00 and are available at/through Lowe's, Home Depot, COSTCO, ACE, and Amazon.

There are many reviews of successes and a few failures of these sandless sandbags on individual websites and on Amazon. While the use of these 'dams' appears better than traditional sandbags they may not always be successful as described in the various failures.



### PARKING! DID YOU KNOW?

- Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot.
- Parking from 2AM -7AM requires a permit
- Speed limit is 15MPH
- At the end of your driveway is a flat curb called a "ribbon." The ribbon is not part of the driveway, and therefore, vehicles must be fully in the driveway and not over the ribbon.
- Trailers are prohibited in driveways, unless actively being loaded or unloaded. All unattached trailers must otherwise be parked at the rear of the Clubhouse lot, with a permit, if parking overnight.
