- REW Landscaping officially started 6/1/21. They will service Lake of the Woods every Wednesday/Thursday. Please remember to put out your signs. They are new and will not know any previous direction.
- Irrigation has had opportunities. I'm happy to share that the pump on North Carolwood is scheduled for repair/replacement on 6/4/21. Unfortunately, the second pump on North Carolwood has stopped working. The pump technician will inspect the second pump on 6/4/21. REW will be taking over irrigation responsibilities as well.
- The siding repairs on Meadowood have been completed. Painting of these homes is currently underway and should be completed within two weeks.
- Thank you to all the homeowners who responded to the driveway safety concerns. B&G has been contacted for over 20 driveway replacements.
- The lake pier has been re-painted and is ready for the summer season.

John A. Kuhn- Photographer

We hope you had a chance to enjoy the work of Faye Tambrino, May's Artist of the Month. Faye set a very high bar as her work was absolutely excellent. Following her great start is John A. Kuhn, L.O.W.'s residential, professional photographer and the mastermind behind the Artist of the Month Program.

John started his photographic work in high school in Vincennes, Indiana working on the year book and the bi-weekly "All Students Magazine." He shot several weddings during his early years and found it challenging. After graduating from one of the most prestigious engineering schools in the US, he entered the US Navy for a 4 year stint, which brought him to the then, Orlando Naval Training Center, after spending a little over a year at Glenview Naval Air Station north of Chicago. He was in charge of the telephone system for the naval base and met people from the Winter Park Telephone Company. He ended up working for that company for 15 years, managing the subsidiary companies.

Later, John joined NASA Kennedy Space Center as their Voice Systems Leader. His office was next to the video group that also did the still photography work. He spent a considerable amount of time learning the basics and advanced techniques they had perfected.

He started photographing lighthouses all up and down the East Coast. Getting critiques from the top people of that group, he became familiar and proficient in high quality work. Majoring in landscapes, his highest honor was to be selected by the Capitol Art Show in Tallahassee to show his work. The show has a magazine featuring their top selections with photos and the stories behind the artist. He has shown his work across the Southeast including the Million Pines Show in Central Georgia. He has and uses Nikon's Pro Gear to its highest level, such as all F2.8 Lens and a 24 mm Tilt/Shift Lens. He prints, mounts and stretches all his own prints, up to 44 inches wide.

John will be attending and speaking at the **First Friday** event on **June 4th**. Come on out to meet him and other L.O.W. residents during this fantastically fun night.

You can also meetup with John on Sundays **June 6th** and **27th** from **2 to 4p.m.** in the auditorium to "talk photography." He will be set up to show you really sharp focusing capabilities with Nikon's "Live View." He'll explain why one would need a Tilt/Shift Lens, starting with what in the world is a Tilt/Shift Lens. You ask the questions and he'll do his best to answer them or at least guide you in the right direction on the topic. Money Matters—Jo Elmlblad

Budget vs. Actual Expense comparison of our operating budget through the end of April shows Actual expense of \$103,779.35 for the month of April compared to Budget of \$114,792.53, a difference of \$11,013.28. YTD Actual expense totaled \$442,658.81 for our first four months of the year vs. Budget of \$459,170.12 for a difference of \$16,511.31. Increases in material cost (lumber, siding, caulking, etc.) will likely impact several budget areas as we move through the year. We have already exceeded our annual budget for 6055 Maintenance Repairs/Supplies (\$8,000 annual budget vs. actual expense of \$9,013.46.) The landscape upgrade portion of our budget (\$16,666.68 YTD budget vs. actual expense of \$38,569.74 with annual budget of \$50,000) continues to be an item to watch. These two budget categories are somewhat challenging as the expense for either can be an operating or a Reserve fund expense. Classifying them correctly can be difficult as it may require splitting expense categories on one invoice.

Roof repair expense of \$1,355 was paid in April. Insurance coverage for roofs and rising homeowner's insurance expense is a hot topic in Florida with some insurance companies tightening their requirements for roof coverage. This area of concern reinforces the need to take stock of our Reserve Study results and assure we plan for the future, especially as we look to roof replacement in a few years. (Our roofs were last replaced in 2006-2010 and cost us \$4.2 million. Reserve Study projects roof replacement cost of \$4.3 million with start date of 2024.)

Our AR Aging report as of April 30th showed Monthly Assessment Receivable total of \$23,266.29 compared to \$29,677/37.39 for March seemingly reflecting a nice reduction in this area. Total of Aging Summary for April which includes Receivables as well as numerous service fees and charges by Bono, was \$30,573.77 compared to \$37,576.93 for March. According to Bono's collection report for the month, we had 11 accounts with balance settled, 1 bankruptcy, 3 intent to lien, 13 reminder notices, and 7 accounts with our attorney.

Regarding expenses paid from our Reserve Accounts in April, we have the following:

- April 16, 2021 \$2,500 Insurance Appraisal
- April 27, 2021 \$ 650 Sidewalk Repair Reimbursement to Owner
- April 29, 2021 \$1,188 Sidewalk Repair Reimbursement to Owner
- April 30, 2021 \$4,600 All Terrain-For curb/road repair Truewood/Carolwood

Landscape upgrade of the clubhouse is likely to occur soon. A landscape architect's plan for the upgrade has been on display at the clubhouse. Two proposals are in hand and additional ones have been requested. Coming soon too, is converting amenity access to an electronic card system.

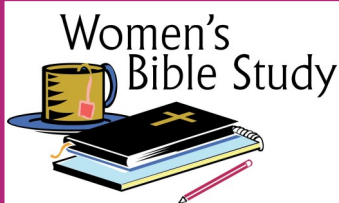


It's Bunco Time!!!
