Portal Access

The new portal has gone live, and the welcome email was sent out. If you did not receive it, please check your spam folder or contact the office, and we will email you a password reset. We thank you for your patience these past few months while getting it up and running. The various association documents that will be available via the portal are still being audited. Once verified, the document access will be activated for your convenience. Although we are planning an assistance day to help owners set up autopay, please don't hesitate to stop by the office, and we will be happy to assist.

Payment Options

Starting April 1, 2024, the monthly assessment will be \$254.44. The payment options are paying via the portal, using the coupon book, autopay through your bank, or mailing/delivering a check to the clubhouse office. The new coupon books have been ordered and will arrive in your mailbox soon. Although using the coupon book is optional, every owner will receive a booklet, even if they have already signed up for autopay, to ensure the coupon option is available. If you pay via check, please issue your payment to Lake of the Woods Homeowners Association and mail or hand-deliver it to 300 Carolwood Point, Fern Park, FL 32730.

Carolwood Storm Drain Repair

The storm drain on Carolwood and the sidewalk behind Truewood leading to Lake of the Woods Blvd. have been approved for repair and are scheduled to commence after the primary election on March 19.

Water Remediation

The water remediation project is progressing. Although none of the areas are completely finished, we appreciate your continued patience while this project is underway. Notably, several trees had to be removed to allow for proper flow of the water. Note: Do not remove the cloth over the drains; once the engineer has finalized each area, this will be removed. Several irrigation lines, wires, and cables were damaged during the process. Thank you to those affected for contacting your service providers to get it repaired. Following area A, the project will continue behind Woodridge. Sod will be installed after all areas are completed.

Parking & Towing

Since the new parking and towing rule went into effect, several vehicles have been towed. Please comply with the parking regulations to avoid potential towing. Visitor parking at the end of the streets is for visitors only. Clubhouse parking is for additional owner parking. Parking permits are required in these areas between 2 am and 7 am.

Special Assessment and Loan Letter for the Roof Replacement

The attorney is still reviewing the special assessment letter. When finalized and approved by the Board, the letter will be sent to all owners. Thank you for your patience.

Upcoming Rule Change

At its February 19 meeting, the Board voted to change the trash collection rule, whereby all waste/garbage placed outside must be contained in closed containers. Additional details and time to obtain a trash container will be provided before implementing this new rule.

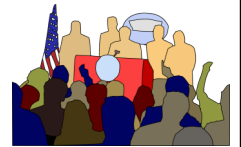
Registration Opens at 6:30 p.m. Meeting Begins at 7:00 p.m.

- **TOWING STARTED FEBRUARY 5, 2024 to comply with the change in the Parking Enforcement rule approved at the duly called December 19, 2023 Board of Directors meeting.** A letter to this effect was hand-delivered to everyone on January 5th, 2024. *To prevent the potential towing of your vehicle or that of your guests, please make sure to comply with the parking regulations.*

MONEY MATTERS - Jo Elmlblad

Our change in management, accounting oversight, banking, and accessing a new community portal has slowed our progress in getting 2024 activity on track. Office and rec staffing shortages add to our challenge.

Draft versions of our Financial summary statements for January were reviewed during Finance's monthly meeting. The balance sheet review confirmed we are moving the operating account and funds to Truist Bank from Pacific Premier Bank. We also have 3 CDs (\$233K total) at Pacific Premier Bank, maturing in March 2024 and May 2024. These CDs, when matured, will be moved to a different bank or financial institution of our choosing. Adding an operating account to Schwab for these funds may provide the best money management and CD options.

Our change in banking assessment payments contributed to significantly upping our Account Receivable total as of January 31. AR Summary report showed 372 delinquent owners with \$121,288.38 due compared to December results, 46 owners owing \$38,418.19. However, this was a draft summary, and totals are not final or guaranteed to be accurate until additional programming and adjustments are made. Some of us weren't sure how or to whom to pay our monthly assessments. The fallback option is to take a check to the office IF you have checks.

As we change banks and accounting companies, a major concern and question is whether there'll be a processing fee when making our monthly assessment payments. Kristina is looking into the options and will work toward eliminating processing fees. The Board did approve a motion at last month's meeting that no late fees or interest will be charged in January, February, or March for accounts that have not been delinquent as of December 31. The new portal is now available and can be accessed to verify your account balances and info. Contact the office if you haven't received information to set up your access. You'll receive more instructions soon for setting up your payment method, effective April 1, 2024. Remember, as of that date, the new monthly assessment payment amount will be \$254.44.

Regarding actual expense totals versus budget for January, we are missing some expense items for the month, and we have several instances of what appear to be duplicate payments of invoices. End of the year invoicing and payments may need additional review as we moved accounting responsibility from Premier to Andersen effective January 1.

At the February 20, 2024 Board meeting, an estimate of our total fund balance, based on reviewing January bank reconciliations, totaled \$4,483,888.74, according to Treasurer Lauretta Lumkes. As a comparison, our unaudited total fund balance at year-end was \$4,486,107.14.

The Board made several decisions at its February meeting: a new hedge for LOW Blvd-Oxford Rd (\$3,201); the repair of Carolwood storm drain and sidewalk behind Truewood (\$4,192); a new pool service contract; volunteers needed for stormwater drains, sewer, and roadways committee; election day volunteers needed for traffic management. Water intrusion fixes are still in progress. Roofing special assessment info will be released in early March. Garbage and trash will now have to be placed curbside inside a garbage can (to help reduce the incidence of plastic bags being ripped open and squirrels, raccoons, dogs, coyotes, and other critters having a picnic on trash pick-up days).

We'll be electing new board members at our Annual Meeting in March. Thanks to those candidates willing to serve and those board members who continue to serve. A big **Thank You** to the volunteers who help our community, especially the ladies filling in at the office these past several weeks. Board members, committees, and special event assistance all contribute to making this community a desirable place to be. It does take a village!

- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays. (Debris must be in a container or tied in a bundle.)

Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information

- Appliances and electronic waste must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled for white goods/electronic waste, these item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. on Thursdays. Regular bulk items do not require advanced scheduling to be picked up.



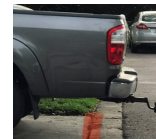
CAN COLLECTION ON FRIDAYS!!!

PARKING! DID YOU KNOW?

- Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot. Violators are subject to towing without notice.
- Parking from 2AM -7AM requires a permit. Go to LOW website: (www.lakeofthewoodshoa.com) to fill out the form.
- **Speed limit is 15MPH**
- At the end of your driveway is a flat curb called a “ribbon.” The ribbon is not part of the driveway, and therefore, vehicles must be fully in the driveway and not over the ribbon. See photo for example.
- Trailers are prohibited in driveways, unless actively being loaded or unloaded.

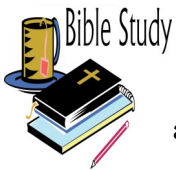
