PARKING! DID YOU KNOW?

- Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot.

Billie commented that host Ronda Christiansen is genuinely committed to supporting her elderly neighbors. Ronda aims to help them stay in their homes and leverage their home equity to elevate their overall quality of life, by capitalizing on

the equity growth of the past 4 years. This information holds significance for individuals aged 65 and above, offering insights into financial planning and the potential to enhance their retirement outlook, even if they don't presently intend to implement these strategies.



MONEY MATTERS - Jo Elmblad

Our Revenue and Expense report shows monthly actual expense of \$120,588.15 vs Budget of \$134,010.66 as of the end of August for a difference of \$13,422.51. YTD figures show actual expense of \$973,298.17 vs Budget of \$1,072,085.28 for a difference of \$98,787.11. A review of our Balance Sheet operating bank accounts and CD's did raise some concern regarding being in compliance with FDIC guidelines. We had a couple of CD's maturing and renewing in June and July. Balance sheet total assets as of August 31st were \$4,453,854.50 compared to \$4,414,941.28 at the end of July. Accounts Receivable increased to \$34,532.36 at the end of August compared to \$32,176.84 in July. August AR Aging report indicated 49 delinquent owners compared to 50 in July. Our actual delinquent **assessment** total was \$29,937.80. The difference between that total and the \$32,176.84 is fees and charges to be paid to Premier. A charge of \$25 for a "Violation Admin Fee", questioned last month, has been reversed.

Irrigation repair continues to be an increasing concern from an expense perspective as well as customer satisfaction. August expense for this category was only \$1000 for monthly "check up" visits and we are already over our annual budget -\$15,348.64. We are under budget for onsite maintenance payroll (\$19,952.79) as we are understaffed in that area. The Board has approved using our under budget situation there to offset \$10,000 additional irrigation repair expense. Employee medical insurance expense is also under budget YTD (\$9,050.40) as is Tree Maintenance,(\$34,920). However we expect Budget Tree to start tree trimming activity in the community in mid October. Trimming of palms by our landscape contractor also continues at a slow pace within the community.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of August 31, 2023 were Capital \$216,210.46; R&R \$805,868.44; Roof \$2,917,351.76..

We have begun budget planning for 2024. The Department of Labor has published the August CPI and that figure, if used to develop our estimated income for 2024, would bring our assessment income total to \$\$1,609,809. Using the August figure, our monthly assessment total would increase to \$253.80. We'll have to wait for the September CPI to firm up what our actual increase could be. Using the August CPI result, and roughly estimating expenses, we're approximately \$\$29K over budget. There are still a number of areas we need to clarify so far as future expense is concerned. Our operating budget does include allocations to reserve funds and over the past several years, we've increased our proportion of reserve allocations to be consistent with our 2020 Reserve Study recommendations. However, with our CPI restriction, we are limited in assessment increases which makes conforming to the Study recommendations difficult. Our contribution to reserve funds in 2023 will total \$521,100. The suggested allocation by the Study for 2024 is \$561,600. That's a big \$40K increase. If we're going to be start re roofing activity in late 2023 or 2024 we'll need to take a critical look at funding our reserves and keeping our operating budget at a level adequate to do what we need to do, plus have a special assessment to pay.

As suggested previously, to generate some additional income, we could add a capital contribution requirement for new owners. This is already common for many communities. New owners contribute \$1000 or whatever amount is determined and that is an added fee at closing. That fee would go to our reserve funds. This would only impact new owners but would give us an estimated \$20-35K annually to add to our reserve funds. The Board will be discussing this at its October meeting.

Determination and clarification of what we're going to need to complete our roof project should be our primary focus now. The Board has amended their motion to complete roof replacement on 25 buildings to complete roof replacement on 8 buildings instead and plan and establish funding to do all the roofs. The estimated expense for the 25 buildings was \$2.55 million. Estimate for the 8 buildings is approximately \$900,000. The priority list for getting all buildings done is being amended to assure the buildings with the most serious roof leak problems are done first. A list of the 8 buildings with first priority for reroofing should be released by October 1st.

As we determine the facts and figures for roof replacement as well as water intrusion mitigation, we'll need to coordinate with our 2024 budget development. Typically, next year's budget is approved at our November board meeting.

TRASH AND RECYCLING PICK UP INFORMATION

- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays. (Debris must be in a container or tied in a bundle.

Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information

- Appliances and electronic waste must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled for white goods/electronic waste, these item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. on Thursdays. Regular bulk items do not require advanced scheduling to be picked up.
- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on Friday, the bulk item(s) **<u>must</u>** be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.

No trash or bulk item(s) can be put out prior to 6p.m. the day before pick up.

SANDLESS SANDBAGS?

Following Hurricanes Ian and Nicole, research was conducted to identify an alternative to traditional sandbags to protect Lake of the Woods Townhomes from flood waters. Five sandless sandbags (dams) have been identified, but only three appear suitable to provide abatement of flood waters threatening residences: The three sandless sandbags are:

QUICK DAM: a self-activating patented gel barrier, tubelike height of 3-4", width 8", comes in various lengths, www.quickdams.com; QUICK DAM: 888-761-4405.

HYDRABARRIER: water fill barrier, tubelike height 3-4", width 8" comes in various lengths, www.hydrabarrier.com; WATERSHED INNOVATIONS: 888-876-4068.

PIG HOME SOLUTIONS: water fill barrier, tubelike; height 3-5", width 8", lengths vary, www.newpig.com, NEW PIG: 855-493-HOGS.

All prices vary with length from \$21.99 to \$100.00 and are available at/through Lowe's, Home Depot, COSTCO, ACE, and Amazon.

There are many reviews of successes and a few failures of these sandless sandbags on individual websites and on Amazon. While the use of these 'dams' appears better than traditional sandbags they may not always be successful as described in the various failures.


