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CAM CORNER/MANAGER'S REPORT

PAYMENT OF MONTHLY ASSESSMENTS

Please know the portal is changing from Andersen Management Services to Premier Management. As such, payments can no longer be completed via the Andersen Management's Portal. If you pay your assessments by use of the coupons, at www.truist.com/payments, or if you are set up for automatic payments via Truist Bank (previously BB&T), please know these payment options remain in place. THE ACCESS CARD SYSTEM LAUNCHES SEPTEMBER 7, 2022

Please remember to pick up your Access Card prior to September 7, 2022. Once the system is launched, access to the clubhouse and playground area is contingent on you having the card. The card functions as a key and all doors and the gate will be locked at all times. The card will provide you access between the hours of 9:00 am to 9:00 pm while the facilities are open for use. After the launch a second card can be purchased for \$10.00. This price is good through December 31, 2022, whereafter the price will increase to \$25.00. A maximum of two active cards are permitted per household at this time.

MONEY MATTERS—JO ELMBLAD

Financial reports, summarized through July 31, 2022 include Budget vs. Actuals report showing monthly Actual expense of \$110,625.62 vs Budget of \$120,025.75 for a difference of \$9,400.13. YTD figures show Actual expense of \$751,740.12 vs. Budget of \$840,180.26 for a difference of \$88,440.14.Tree Maintenance (-\$30,813.43), Payroll Maintenance (-\$33,491.69), and Employees Group Insurance (\$-16,526.33) are the largest under budget expense items

contributing to our YTD under budget results. Irrigation repair expense for the month totaled \$4,722 and included repairs by new vendor Sprinkler Repair. Part of that irrigation expense was \$2,167 for North side pressure tank and timer. **Annual** budget for irrigation is \$20,000 and as of July 31, our irrigation expense exceeds that at \$22,982.18. Pool expense for the month included \$695 for sump pump and \$395 for auto-fill kit. We spent \$3,000 in July to clear and clean up the area behind the tennis courts as well as behind 100-130 Carolwood.

Our Accounts Receivable total at the end of July was \$28,949.42 per our Balance Sheet compared to June's month end total of \$31,161.69. Our largest delinquent account, owing \$13,707.13 as of July 31 represents 47% of our delinquency total. Now transitioning again to a different accounting entity puts us at risk of delaying follow up in identifying and collecting delinquent accounts. Not having continuity in the accounting area makes us more likely to miss inconsistencies or problems.

We've started budget planning for 2023 but will be fine tuning the numbers in the next couple of months. We won't know what our assessment income will be until mid October when the September CPI is published. As noted last month, using June's 2022 CPI indicator we'd anticipate a monthly assessment increase, effective April 1, 2023 of \$18.18, which would make the new monthly assessment amount \$244.95 (8% increase.) July's indicator actually was a little less than June's and would calculate to an increase of \$18.13. With two more months to go, we have an idea of what the final number will be but must wait for the September result to finalize.

The Board has approved Platinum Landscaping as our new contractor and Sprinkler Repair for irrigation maintenance. Though we were supposed to be close to having a fully functioning system with REW going over the property for the past year fixing various irrigation problems, it appears there's more work to be done.

Premier Association Management is now on property and working on our transition to their accounting and management systems.

Implementation of our security access system is now scheduled for September 7th. Access cards are being issued at the office. Each household may have up to two cards. The first card is issued at no cost but the second will cost you \$10. After 12/31/22. the second card will cost \$25.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of July 31, 2022 were Capital \$190,160.08; R&R \$814,068.11; and Roof \$2,492,135.41.



Identifying Nature's Gifts

Let's try to make this space really practical this month.

You see a beautiful plant or a bloom on a plant and have no idea what it is, but you <u>must have</u> it for your garden. There is an easy way to identify what it is if you have a mobile phone that takes pictures or better still a smart phone. In the process you can directly get detailed information about the plant.

To set up to do this on a smart phone, download one of the following apps: PlantNet, LeafSnap, Plantsnap, and iNaturalist for iOS or Android. These are available for free although there are also premium features. The free version, however, is all you really need. PlantNet seems to be the most versatile so that's what we will look at here.





Once you download and open the app (e.g., from Google Play), if you are trying to identify a plant, get to this screen which lets you take a picture or open your camera's gallery for a stored picture.

Then you accept that, and this screen opens (apologies – screens are Snips of a video). You select leaf, flower, fruit, branch to compare the database photos to yours.

There are literally millions of photos (8 million+) in this database which is part of a worldwide project to digitize plant Information. There is quite a bit more to this project than this identification step that is very interesting (Google: PlantNet).

Once you accept the leaf, flower, etc. choice, this screen presents the results. There is a lot here starting with your plant photo on top. Below are rows of other photos selected by the app as

possible matches from the database. Each includes the name (common and scientific), a rating for the match in stars as well as % probability of the match.

Within the app, you can select databases focused on USA, Europe, Asia, etc. The app is actually French but includes numerous serious providers and individuals from all over the world. The World Flora seems to work best for very diverse plant collections like the variety you will find at Leu Gardens in Orlando. PlantNet has been tried all over Leu Gardens with 90+% accuracy.

If you don't have a smartphone or you take a whole bunch of digital pictures on vacation, you can download the app to a computer and use it to do the identification of the plants in photos you load onto the computer.

This short piece describes only the beginnings of what the apps named above provide. Explore them a bit and expand your knowledge of what Mother Nature has provided us. Have fun!!!

WHAT MAKES A GOOD DIRECTOR?

The role of a director in a homeowners association consists of many aspects. It involves more than sitting behind a table at a meeting once a month and voting "yea" or "nay" to motions. First and foremost, the role of the director involves responsibility, which begins before the director is elected. It would be wise for the director to gain knowledge of the community before running for board. Joining committees, attending board meetings and social events can accomplish this and will help the director assume the responsibilities of the board with little learning time.

Once elected, responsibility means representing all residents and making decisions on *their* behalf. Proposals will come before the board that may not be popular, but the good director must risk the wrath of some residents and vote for the good of the entire community.

In the same vein, a good director needs to be tolerant. Our community consists of diverse ages, from senior citizens to young couples and children. While this is a wonderful mixture, it makes for conflicting needs and concerns. Phone calls will come, sometimes in the middle of the night, and concerns, whether large or small, must be handled to the best of the director's ability. A director will be stopped on the street, usually at inopportune times, with questions or complaints. A negative attitude on the part of a director is unacceptable no matter how many times the same complaint or question is heard. Remember, it is usually the resident's first time approaching the director on a particular subject, so patience is a virtue.

A good director needs to be informed, which may mean attending many community committee meetings. For example, when a director has a problem understanding the financial statements each month, attendance at finance committee meetings is in order. This will fully prepare the director to make decisions on financial reports rather than giving a "rubber stamp" vote. It is not necessary to attend every community meeting, but the director should attend enough to have a handle on the overall structure of community activities and committees.

As a way of keeping directors in our community informed, the president of the board annually assigns a director as ex-officio for each committee. The director attends all meetings of the committee, offers guidance, and makes status reports to the board.

Attending social events within the community is a good way to become informed. Whenever a director is visible, the residents have an opportunity to discuss issues and share their opinions. Sometimes those opinions are not something a director wants to hear, especially in a social setting, but it comes with the territory.

Does all this responsibility, tolerance, and knowledge take time? Most certainly! A great deal of time will be required to serve the community well and a real commitment must be made for the duration of the term. A good director possesses qualities such as integrity, morality, and ability to guide the community in its maintenance of originally conceived covenants, conditions, and restrictions.

Do you have the time, knowledge, tolerance, and responsibility to be a good director? If the answer is yes, there is a seat waiting for you!



Exciting news water babies, we will be offering Water Aerobics again from now until **September 28, 2022**. There will be sessions





DONATE TO ENGLISH ESTATES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL









LOW MUSIC GROUP
