- Australian Pine (Casuarina Species)
- Brazilian Pepper (Schinus Terbinthifolius)
- Cajeput Tree or Punk Tree (Melaleuca Quinquenervia)
- Camphor (Cinnamomum Camphora)
- Chinaberry (Melia Azedarach)
- Chinese Tallow Tree (Triadica Sebifera)
- Ear Tree (Enterolobium Cyclocarpum)
- Eucalyptus (Eucalyptus Robusta)
- Flamegold Tree (Koelreuteria Elegans)
- Guava (Psidiuim Species)
- Jacaranda (Jacaranda Acutifolia)
- Java Plum (Syzygium Cumini)
- Mimosa (Albizia Julifrissin)
- Paper Mulberry (Broussonetia Papyrifera)
- Rosewood (Delbergia Sissoo)
- Tung Oil Tree (Aleurites Fordii)
- Umbrella Tree (Schefflera Actinophylia)
- White Lead Tree (Leucaena Leucocephala)

No permit is necessary to remove these trees.

Some of the above-named trees are actually illegal to plant, transport or sell. Some trees have been prohibited by national, state, county and local regulations because of safety, health and environmental concerns.

PLEASE DO NOT PLANT FERNS

By their nature, ferns are invasive and require expensive hand removal.
