### March 24 Special Meeting And Monthly Assessment Update

For those of you who participated in the March 24, 2026, Special Membership Meeting, most of you know that the Meeting did not attain the necessary Quorum of sixty (60%) percent, and therefore, no Meeting could take place.

The purpose of the Meeting was to waive full funding of the Reserves, and to Vote to raise the Assessments to pay for partial funding of the Reserves. Without a Vote of the Membership to waive full funding of Reserves, by law, the Association's Budget must provide for full funding of said Reserves, which would require additional monthly Assessments of approximately \$70.00 per month to be voted into effect by the Membership.

The Board has proposed raising the Assessments by \$20.00 per month, which would be the minimum amount required for partial funding of the (legally required) Reserve funds. This Action will require an additional Meeting and Vote of the Membership, and the Board of Directors is scheduling a Second Special Members' Meeting on May 12, 2026. The good news is that the Quorum required for the Second Special Membership Meeting is only thirty (30%) percent.

If you have already submitted a "Limited Proxy" for the March 24, 2026, Meeting, you do not need to submit an additional Proxy for the May 12, 2026, Special Membership Meeting, unless you wish to change either your Proxy holder or your vote on your Proxy. Should you wish to vote in person, you may certainly do so.

Every Member who has not submitted a Proxy for the March 24<sup>th</sup> Meeting should complete and submit a "Limited Proxy," even if you plan on attending in person, so that a Quorum may be attained.

We ask you to please review the materials included with the Notice of Special Membership Meeting (to be mailed to you later this month) and pay particular attention to the Letter from the Board of Directors, which will provide additional information to support your participation in this critical Special Membership Meeting. The monthly assessment will remain at \$260.65 for April and May, but will change effective June 1, 2026, based on the results of the second vote.

### Roofing

Preparations for the next roof replacements are underway. Allied Roofing Consultants will review the roofs to ensure the previous order remains, with the worst first. We anticipate starting in May, pending confirmation of material delivery and mobilization, and sufficient collection of owners' payments to pay the contractor. If your unit has unique features (e.g., spiked gutters, solar panels, vents) on the building, the affected owners will be asked to complete a form identifying the item(s) and their preferred course of action. Thank you for your continued patience.

### After-Hour Calls

Several owners requested after-hours services for issues that cannot wait for regular business hours. Examples of after-hour services include flooding due to irrigation leaks, street parking blocking access for emergency vehicles, roof leaks (on the weekends – no one can be on the roof during a rain for safety reasons), and similar emergencies. The Fiber-Optic installation, originally scheduled for the first quarter, is running slightly behind schedule. We will update owners and residents with additional information as soon as work is scheduled.

**Proactive Maintenance Plan – Building Envelope Review – List of items to look for**

The staff engaged in proactive maintenance begins by blowing off roofs, cleaning gutters, and pressure-washing walkways and driveways. The building envelope (exterior) is then examined for repairs, and open work orders are completed. Below is a list of some items that staff look for and address. However, residents can also look for and report these issues to the office. A work order will then be opened for the maintenance team.

- Wood/siding rot
- Nails working their way out of the siding
- Window trim damage
- Caulking needs
- Spot paint as needed
- Check and clean all in-ground drains in the surrounding area
- Repair of electrical enclosures in the surrounding area (recently replaced)
- Work orders will be created for larger matters found needing correction

**Landscaping**

A Budget Tree Service will complete the annual tree assessment as soon as they have sufficient growth to make a proper assessment.

Morning Dew Lawnscape has trimmed back the freeze-damaged material; removal of some dead shrubs, plants, and hedges is pending. Much (not all) of the landscaping is coming back, and we are now waiting to see which areas are still in recovery mode and will produce new growth. The tops of many plants may be dead, but the roots are okay and will start sending out shoots. It will take time to recover from the freeze. We appreciate your patience while we try to save as much of the landscaping as possible. Trimming of the sides and backs will continue through April, due to the freeze. Leaf drops have slowed, and cleanup is in progress.

Sod replacement will start in April, and the first locations have been approved. The second round will be assessed in April and is planned for board consideration in May. A sign-up sheet for sod, jasmine, and tree installation is posted in the clubhouse lobby. Requests will be reviewed and presented to the board, group by group, for replacement. We will work to ensure the worst locations are addressed first and that the irrigation is working in all locations considered. Residents may be asked to assist with watering new landscaping for at least the first 30 days to ensure its survival.

**Reminders**

- Participation in membership voting is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT.
- The County picks up yard waste on Wednesdays – Place your yard debris curbside in containers, bags, or bundles.
- Please be courteous to your neighbors and pick up after your dogs. No one appreciates the smell or mess of dragging deposits from the soles of their shoes into their homes.
- Please respect other people’s driveways and private spaces.
- Please be courteous and stay a decent distance from the back and sides of buildings. It can be uncomfortable and startling for residents when someone is walking close to their windows and back enclosures.
- Garden flags are prohibited except during decoration periods.
- Ground lighting placed outside of your courtyard is prohibited. If you need lights to illuminate your walkway, only security lighting is permitted with prior ARC approval.

Payment details: Payments are due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month and considered delinquent after the 10<sup>th</sup>. Late fees and interest are applied on the last day of the month.



Please remember that the monthly assessment fee is due April 1, 2026. The Board has approved waiving late fees and interest for April and May due to delays caused by the March 24 and upcoming May 12 meetings, which will affect the fee amount, and to accommodate the ordering and distribution of the coupon books. This waiver applies ONLY to all accounts that are up to date and paid. **However, you do not need a coupon book to pay your monthly assessment on time. Feel free to stop by the office with your check. Lorna will accept your payment and provide a receipt for your records. If you use auto-pay online, please sign in to the portal to ensure you adjust the monthly payment amount to be withdrawn beginning April 1.**

The February 2026 Financial Statements show the following balances in our Reserve Accounts:

- Roof                 \$1,051,587.75
- R & R                \$315,500.80
- Capital              \$245,308.63

Our Operating Funds balance totaled \$355,020.90. The accounts receivable balance for monthly assessments was \$78,915.94 (44 owners). This balance reflects a decrease of \$2,111.54 and a reduction of 3 owners from our January 2026 numbers. The \$4,000 special assessment fees continue to come in ahead of schedule from some owners, helping us get started on the remaining roofs sooner.

Overall, the actual expenses for February 2026 were \$7,323.51 below budget. Notable items of expense included office supplies (for owner mailings), paint, irrigation repair, a Municipal Service Benefit Fee, and exercise equipment repairs. In addition, \$4,000.00 was paid from our Reserve Funds for driveway repairs resulting from irrigation damage.

The March 24 reserve funding vote is a stark reminder that calculating the annual monthly assessment based on the yearly CPI has seriously hampered our ability to keep up with the ever-increasing costs of services. The Board has tasked the Steering Committee with the lengthy, but necessary process of reviewing and revising our Declarations of Easements, Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions, enabling us to amend and update our documents. Improving our funding options is one of our main objectives.
