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CAM CORNER/MANAGER'S REPORT

Dear Owners & Residents:

Here's a quick reference guide to currently scheduled matters

- August 4, 2022 Roofing Meeting with Allied Consulting and the GAF representative at 6 p.m. Open to residents for attendance.
- August 8, 2022 101-119 Eastwind Lane building painting commencement
- August 23, 2022 Primary Election at the Clubhouse
- August 31, 2022 Transition in management companies
- September 1, 2022 Expected date for permanent landscape company
- September 7, 2022 New launch date for the access card system

The launch of the access card system has been postponed until after Labor Day and is currently scheduled for September 7, 2022. A maximum of 2 active cards per household is permitted. Secondary cards can be purchased after September 7, 2022, for \$10 up until December 31, 2022. Starting January 1, 2023, additional cards will be \$25.

The Best Choice Lawncare will be providing temporary landscape services on Saturdays for the month of August. Proposals for permanent services are being obtained and will be before the board for consideration at the August board meeting.

As noted in the July issue, it has been a pleasure providing you with management services, and I wish you all the best in the future!

TRASH AND RECYCLING PICK UP INFORMATION

- Regular trash will be picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays.
- Recycling is now picked up every Friday. You can contact Seminole County, 407-665-2260 to request recycle bins.
- Aluminum cans **ONLY** are picked up every Friday by the LOW Can-Can Committee. Be sure to separate your aluminum cans from other recycling if you wish to have them collected by the Can-can Committee.
- Yard trash is picked up on Wednesdays.

Bulk Item(s) Pick Up Information

- White goods and electronic waste must be scheduled in advance by calling 407-464-0664.
- Once pick up is scheduled for white goods/electronic waste, these item(s) may be placed on the curb after 6 p.m. on Thursdays. Regular bulk items do not require advanced scheduling to be picked up.
- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on Friday, the bulk item(s) must be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.

No trash or bulk item(s) can be put out prior to 6p.m. the day before pick up.



MONEY MATTERS—JO ELMBLAD

CPI & Assessment Update: Per the U.S. Department of Labor's website, using the most recently published June 2022 index, the calculated amount of increase we could have effective next April is \$18.18. Our actual figure will be determined after the September 2022 index is published, and we're able to compare that to the September 2021 index. We normally won't see that number until mid-October.

Financial reports summarized through June 30th, 2022, reflect the following: Budget vs. Actuals report for June indicates monthly Actual expense of \$96,216.30 vs Budget of \$120,025.75 for a difference of \$23,809.45. YTD figures show Actual expense of \$641,092.49 vs. Budget of \$720,154.50 for a difference of \$79,062.01. Expense categories well under budget include Maintenance staff payroll (-\$33,314.36) and Grounds Maintenance (-\$25,026.39.) Grounds Maintenance being under budget was helped along by not having our regular landscape expense for June. That would have been a \$15,975 expense though we did spend \$6,000 for supplemental property mowing in June. In addition to the irrigation repair expense of \$6,510.70 paid from operating in June, we spent \$9,987 from our R&R Reserve for Northside well replacement.

Employment Screening for the month and the year continues to exceed budget at \$300 for the year and Actual expense YTD of \$4,052.72. This expense category also includes paying for employment ads which typically range in the \$600-700 range, as well as drug tests and background checks. We expect this category to continue to increase until we have a stable staffing situation.

The new landscape contract, which was to be effective in July, has been terminated by the contractor. The estimated monthly expense was to be \$18,466.84. Since we currently have no landscape contractor, our grounds will look less appealing than we'd like for the next several months until we have a regular contractor in place.

We begin to look at our budget for 2023 with significant unknowns. Budget planning exercises currently suggest a 10-15% increase will likely be needed just to maintain current services. So we are looking at unknown assessment income and numerous categories of unknown expenses, including salaries and ground maintenance, in trying to develop a workable budget for next year. Additionally, virtually all expenses are increasing.

Our Accounts Receivable total at the end of June was \$31,161.69 on our Balance Sheet compared to May's month-end total of \$29,252.86. A year ago, our Receivables total was \$24,537.98.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of June 30th, 2022, were Capital \$188,730.29; R&R \$819,161.05 and Roof \$2,471,415.85..

Implementation of our security access system is tentatively scheduled for August 1st. Access cards are being issued at the office.

Good news for the community! The Board approved hiring Premier Association Management of Central Florida to provide a full-time CAM manager as well as assuming accounting and management functions effective September 1st. These next few months will be busy as we make the transition to the new management company and start putting our 2023 budget together.

There will be a meeting on August 4th at 6 PM at the clubhouse to see roof shingle color options and get a brief update on the roof replacement project.

On August 23rd, our clubhouse auditorium will be a voting precinct, so be aware of this extra activity on that date.



TURF EATER CONTROL BY RONDA CHRISTIANSEN AND THE LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

As you may have heard, LOW is currently without a full-service landscape contractor. In the interim of establishing an ongoing service, LOW will try to work with individual service contractors to maintain the LOW property landscaping.

Insect control is one of those services, and, in particular, mole cricket and chinch bug problems may need management. The Landscape Committee has

had reports of both and of "bugs" in the LOW turf. Identifying a problem for a contractor to address will help make control easier.

The picture above shows what mole cricket tunnels can look like as the insect moves just below the turf's surface and eats the roots.

The crickets are nocturnal, and you may not see them unless you get out late with a flashlight. There are several kinds of mole crickets, as shown here.

One local expert says our problem here will more likely be chinch bugs. You know you have these when you see a bunch of moth-like critters fly up when you walk across your grass.



Here is what chinch bugs look like through their life cycle. Hatching happens in the Spring and early Summer, with most activity in July.

Chinch bugs may not move around much. Instead, they tend to eat the turf in an expanding circle and may stay in place until the next season, when the cycle will begin where it let off.

Controlling both critters will be a priority for Landscaping. You can help by looking for either in your area and bringing any activity to the attention of the Landscaping Committee. We will work with the contractor to minimize the problem.

A BIT OF NEWS FROM BUILDING & GROUNDS!

The Building & Grounds Committee had not only a hot summer but a busy one. We have completed the first "Water Intrusion" repair location. This has been a long and challenging project up to this point, but now we have more information on how the project will move forward from here. The Committee is in the process of trying to schedule the remaining locations. The first location was on the Northside. It was one (1) building with two (2) units (homes) involved. We have a total of five (5) buildings with ten (10) units (homes) remaining on the Northside.

On the Southside of the property, we have six (6) buildings with nine (9) units involved. The Committee is trying to verify that all of these are valid, and this number could grow if we continue to receive reports of Water Intrusion. The main concern now is that we need to work faster, as we have been incredibly lucky that we have not had to deal with heavy rain or, worse, the threat of a hurricane!

The Committee will be addressing the Board with an update on this project. We will be working to obtain scopes for each of these jobs and moving forward with proposals to complete all.

Building & Grounds would like to thank all residents for their patience and understanding. The Committee is working as best we can to complete this project as efficiently as we can and as quickly as we can. We hope for the best results possible and appreciate your support and understanding.

I would like to request that any homeowner or resident that sees or suspects any "Water Intrusion" report it to the office and to Carol Wilks, Chair Building & Grounds Committee. This will help keep us all on the same page. Reporting your "Water Intrusion" will not only help the Committee, but it also helps the entire community. After all, that is why we do what we do!

We all want to live where the community is lovely and pleasant. We have good neighbors, many volunteers, and most of the time, we have a little fun. When we work hard, we deserve to share the rewards of a job well done.

A big thank you to my committee for all your hard work and support. You all are the BEST!

room for—whatever! And make a few dollars in the process. The Community Market event will be Saturday, October 22nd, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.






