MONEY MATTERS - Jo Elmblad

If ever we have had a challenging year, 2024 will really put us to the test. Our unaudited financial statements summarized as of December 31, 2023, reflect Operating funds totaling \$401,865.24 and a Reserve Fund total of \$4,084,241.90. We are in the midst of transitioning to a different management company and changing our banking relationships. Work has started on water intrusion fixes. We are on the verge of starting our reroofing effort, awaiting a final conperformance bond included. Recent resignations of office/rec staff add another burdle to clear

tract with performance bond included. Recent resignations of office/rec staff add another hurdle to clear.

We close out the year with three operating accounts at three different banks: Truist, Pacific Premier, and First Citizens. Our operating accounts at Pacific Premier Bank (PPB) include a balance of \$87,121.56 as of December 31, plus three CDs (not in the CDARS network) totaling \$\$233,000. Those CDs don't mature until March and May 2024. Our total of accounts at this one bank puts us over the \$250K FDIC insurance limit, which is contrary to our investment guidelines and proper fiduciary oversight. The exposure is being reduced over time as funds are being transferred from the PPB operating account to Truist. Because of the banking and management change, late fees and interest will be waived for January, February and March for those accounts that are current at year's end.

Our December Revenue and Expense summary report showed monthly Actual expense of \$194,828.17 vs. Budget of \$134,010.74 for a difference of -\$60,817.43. YTD figures show Actual expense of \$1,554,952.45 vs. Budget of \$1,608,128 for a difference of \$53,175.55. Since our income variance totals -\$49,462.50 for the year, we have net income of \$3,713.01. We do anticipate some additional adjustments before we close out 2023. The anticipated tree work invoices came through at \$36,200 for annual tree maintenance and \$20,610 for palm tree trimming. Tree maintenance for 2023 totaled \$90,890 vs. annual budget of \$75,000 with some needed work not completed. Legal expense of \$14,437.63 for August through October helped put us over budget for the month of December. We'll certainly have more significant legal expense in the next few months as we finalize roofing contracts and special assessment planning. Roof repair expense during 2023 totaled \$43,401.98 compared to budget of \$25,000. We also spent \$30,776.64 from our R&R Reserve fund in December to purchase two ATV service vehicles for maintenance staff. Accounts Receivable total rose to \$38,418.19 at the end of December compared to \$34,358.51 at the end of

Accounts Receivable total rose to \$38,418.19 at the end of December compared to \$34,358.51 at the end of November. The number of delinquent owners at month end was 46 compared to 42 in November. Our actual delinquent assessment total was \$34,127.61. The \$4,290.58 difference in totals is the total of fees and charges associated with collections activities. We did receive approximately \$11,000 with two recent delinquent account payoffs.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of December 31, 2023, were Capital \$224,389.98; R&R \$830,563.99; Roof \$3,029,287.93. Our 2024 budget includes a monthly assessment change to \$254.44 effective April 1, 2024. Our allocation to our reserve funds in 2024 will total \$543,137 which is approximately 33.7% of our assessment income.

Information regarding a special assessment to complete our roof project done is still being finalized. As mentioned previously, a \$6,500 starting figure for the special assessment is proposed; however, a number of unknowns about the project still remain. Phased timing of the reroofing project makes a big difference in our result. The \$6,500 figure was proposed as a base and likely will not be enough as we look at current proposed expenses and a timeframe to accommodate homeowner insurance requirements. A bank loan or line of credit also is part off the evaluation. Educational sessions to help explain financing options for owners will be scheduled in the near future.

At its January meeting, the Board approved moving forward with creating a capital contribution of \$1,000 which would be paid by new owners. The funds collected would be added to our reserve funds. There would be no cost to existing owners. Making this change requires approval of the community. With attorney sign off, voting for this change could be included along with special assessment voting.

Bromeliads Can Be Mosquito Breeding Grounds By Ronda Christiansen Landscape Committee Chair

Bromeliads, those beautiful and resilient ornamental plants cherished by many for their vibrant colors and low maintenance, may have a dark side. While they're known for their ability to thrive in various conditions and even self-propagate, an

unintended consequence lurks in their leafy embrace – they can transform into ideal mosquito breeding grounds, attract roaches, frogs, and ants, and bring forth a host of other concerns. A bromeliad can house 100 mosquito larvae. It only takes five days from laid eggs to larvae then to grow into those adult flying and biting mosquitoes. Apart from the mosquito and roach issues, bromeliads can face problems like too much or too little water, root rot, and pests such as scale and mealybugs.

Proper maintenance is the key to combating mosquito breeding in bromeliads, i.e., ensuring adequate airflow, prohibiting dense colonies from forming, regularly flushing the water out and coating the water with a small amount of food-grade oil, or using safe larvicides like Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis (BTI).

Alternatives to Bromeliads: Consider plants that add beauty and act as natural mosquito and roach repellents, i.e., **basil, lavender, rosemary, catnip, marigolds, lemon balm, citronella, gerani-ums, peppermint, lemongrass, alliums, and mint**. My personal favorite is Lemongrass and mint. You can enjoy a thriving and pest-free outdoor space by taking proactive measures to prevent infestations and considering alternative mosquito and roach-repelling plants.

Please join us for a **Remove the Bromeliads activity by the front of the pool area** on Saturday, February 10, from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. Only eight volunteers are needed – gloves and tools provided. The Bromeliads will be available for anyone who wants to take them home for their courtyard.
