CAM CORNER MANAGER'S REPORT

I am excited to state that the Access Card Reader System is in the process of being finished. If the system is ready to launch by the time this newsletter is printed, an insert will be included explaining how to obtain your access card to the facilities. If not, this information will be provided to you soon.

The irrigation repairs are ongoing, but all valves have been located, and the irrigation breaker panel servicing the irrigation on the Northside has now been replaced. Review to ensure proper coverage is an ongoing project, and additional heads will need to be installed and adjustments made.

The siding job continues; we passed inspection, the new siding is being installed, and we are excited to have this building put back together soon.

Hurricane Season starts June 1 and ends November 30. If you leave to go out of town, please make sure you put loose items inside as they may become flying projectiles during a storm. Check your supplies and make you have batteries, flashlights, medical supplies, pet supplies, water, cash, and other essentials in preparation for a potential hurricane. Prepare well beforehand to avoid the rush and empty shelves.

PARKING! DID YOU KNOW?

- Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot.
- Parking from 2AM -7AM requires a permit
- Speed limit is 15MPH
- At the end of your driveway is a flat curb called a "ribbon." The ribbon is not part of the driveway, and therefore, vehicles must be fully in the driveway and not over the ribbon.
- Trailers are prohibited in driveways, unless actively being loaded or unloaded. All unattached trailers must otherwise be parked at the rear of the Clubhouse lot, with a permit, if parking overnight.



MONEY MATTERS—JO ELMBLAD

According to our financial statements summarized as of April 30, 2022, our Budget vs. Actuals report for the month reflects Actual expense of

\$107,010.56 vs Budget of \$120,025.75 for a difference of \$13,015.19. YTD figures show Actual expense of \$432,982.41 vs. Budget of \$480,103.01 for a difference of \$47,120.60. Following the same pattern as the last couple of months, we are under budget primarily due to Maintenance staff payroll (-\$21,514.85) and Grounds Maintenance (-\$16,417.06) expens-

es being less than budgeted. Recently losing one of the new maintenance employees will continue the trend. We are over budget in Employment Screening for the month and year with a Budget of \$300 for the year and Actual expense YTD at \$2,710.60. Adequate staffing and salary expenses continue to be a significant challenge. Within the Grounds Maintenance category, we did pay \$2,824.84 for irrigation repairs during the month, including a mainline break representing \$2,077.76 of that total. Kristina confirms that all irrigation valves have been located and repaired, but we're likely to see this repair expense continuing as we experience more breaks or leaks and a lack of coverage. Roof repair expenses for the month totaled \$2,890, which included roof repairs to 15 homes. As the rainy season approaches, we will likely see more expense activity in this area.

Our Accounts Receivable total at the end of April showed as \$26,323.79 on our Balance Sheet compared to March's month-end total of \$27,522.79. We currently have 7 accounts with our attorney for collection activity, and it appears we have 3 more that should be going in that direction.

Our "non-operating expenses" summary for April includes \$13,800 to pay for the inspection phase of our roof consultant report, which was recently completed. Our YTD Reserve expense as of the end of April is \$34,060.

Work on rebuilding the Northside wall is essentially done except for some landscaping. Also, 29 units have reported erosion and water intrusion.

As mentioned earlier, the roof evaluation report has been received. The report includes the results of an inspection of all roofs and ranks the condition of the roofs by building, listing worst to best. This inspection report also identifies numerous flaws and inadequacies with our current roofs, which will be remedied with roof replacement. This includes improving attic ventilation as well as redesigning flat roofs to facilitate water draining off the roof and not ponding. The next phase for roof replacement is focused on planning. This will include preparing specifications in accordance with the current code, manufacturer's warranty requirements, best practices, specifying materials to be incorporated, and establishing a plan for phasing of work. The Bidding phase will come next. Our consultant will solicit firms qualified to bid, provide specs to all vetted bidders, summarize and rank all bids and recommend contract award recipients. The consultant will also work in conjunction with our attorney, BOD, and roofing contractor to formalize the contract.

Balance Sheet Reserve fund totals as of April 30, 2022, were Capital \$185,398.46; R&R \$806,653.55; and Roof \$2,425,484.19.

Our 2021 year-end financial audit and statement have been completed and are available for viewing on our website portal.



MOSQUITO COUNTRY—BY RONDA CHRISTIANSEN AND THE LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

We are indeed blessed to live in a beautiful area of the country. However, there are occasions when we see hurricanes and, more often, mosquitoes. Yes, we live in mosquito country. So much so that the area of Seminole County was once part of, you guessed it, Mosquito County. In "the old days," most of Brevard and Orange counties were part of Mosquito County. We suspect that through the efforts of, perhaps, the Chamber of Commerce and real estate developers, the name changed, and our piece became Seminole County in 1913. Mosquitoes were no longer welcomed – but they came anyway, as we well know.

In fact, the 4 dozen breeds of mosquitoes in Seminole county are often invited to take up residence (and proliferate) by folks who allow water to accumulate in open areas and especially in plants.

One notable offender is the Bromeliad plant. They live because they can store water in essentially an open basin in the plant base for long periods. This water is how they survive since the roots only serve to hold the plant in place. But the accumulated water makes a perfect place for mosquitoes to lay eggs and produce hungry offspring. And, since this March, we had about 5-6 inches of rain versus the more standard 2-3 inches, we should expect "skeeters" to be luvin' it.

That the weather can change is the reason that Lake of the Woods has never allowed Bromeliads to be planted in common areas. In fact, some areas of south Florida have ordinances prohibiting Bromeliads.

HOWEVER, some LOW residents do grow them inside courtyards, and that can be okay if they are careful about managing the mosquito problem. Since mosquitos do better in dirty water, some level of control can be achieved by occasionally flushing the stored water from the plants with a hose.

Chemical warfare is possible, but unfortunately, it also reduces the populations of beneficial insects and might affect birds, both effects increasing mosquito counts.

A biological method of control usually works and involves adding granules of a product containing Bacillus Thuringiensis (one such product is BTI) to the stored water. A few granules per plant once a month will suffice.



CUBAN TREE FROGS

Cuban Treefrogs are considered **invasive** in Florida (and other tropical areas). They are likely to harm our native ecosystems and they secrete slime that can irritate your nose, eyes and may trigger attacks in asthma sufferers. Some of your LOW neighbors have reported seeing them. If you see them use caution and avoid skin to skin contact. One owner who has reached out to an expert has been advised to spray saltwater around their courtyard as a deterrent.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH THIS PICTURE? PARKING VIOLATION

The HOA is actively issuing violation notices. Parking into the street or parking outside of any perimeter of a driveway is a common and frequent violation. All vehicles and all parts of a vehicle (including bumper and trailer hitch) must be completely contained within a driveway. Many residents are unaware that driveways end at the 'ribbon.' The ribbon (some call it a 'flat curb') is actually part of

the street, <u>NOT</u> part of the driveway. In the photo above, the vehicle is about 15" past the property line - truck, bumper, and hitch are all extending over the 'ribbon' and into the street. **It's a violation!**




