Our operating budget, which totals \$1,598,128 for 2023, pays for routine costs such as utilities, insurance, taxes, management fees, routine ground and building maintenance, supplies, etc. . Our monthly assessments will contribute \$1,538,581 to our annual income. Estimated additional income for the year includes \$6,000 in late fees, \$2,500 auditorium rental income, \$9,000 legal fee income (from delinquent owners), and \$7,500 for keys, access cards and miscellaneous. Additionally for 2023 we are adding \$33,547 prior year's surplus to balance our budget. Of that \$1,598,128 budget total, \$521,100 is allocated to our reserve accounts. That's 32.6% of our total income, 33.9% of our assessment income. That leaves us with \$1,077,028 for 2023 operating expenses.

A few years ago (2019), we were putting 28%(\$371,639) into reserves. Our Reserve Study done in 2019 recommended we put more into reserves. So, in 2020, we upped the reserve contribution to \$399,600 (29.56% of assessment income). For 2021 we allocated \$417,725 (30.46%).; \$480,600(33.57%) in 2022; and \$521,100 (33.9%) in 2023. If we're putting a larger percentage of our income into reserves, we have less income available for operating expense. Our operating budget for 2019 was \$995,643; \$952,242 in 2020; 2021 was \$953,785; 2022 was \$951,208; and 2023 is \$1,077,028. That makes keeping up with increasing operating expenses challenging as the operating income available doesn't increase proportionately. Which is more important from a funding perspective? Both areas require careful evaluation and planning.

As noted last month, we have significant expenses to cover over the next several years and we need to be looking for funding solutions. Loans, line of credit, special assessment, grants, additional capital contributions are all possible options to consider. This should be top priority for the community.

As of year end 2023, our un-audited operating account balance was \$520,514.89. Reserve funds totaled \$3,663,203.58 giving us an asset total of \$4,183,718.47.

Our Balance Sheet, as of January 31, indicates asset total of \$4,132,567.96. Accounts Receivable total as of January 31 was \$51,582.43 compared to \$48,160.13 at year-end. The change in banking and management seems to continue to negatively affect our collection process. Late fees were not charged for January. We've been in transition for four months now and still seem to be struggling to get to a reasonable comfort level.

Looking at our AR aging report, as of January 31, our largest delinquent account owes \$15,695.48. January's report shows 78 accounts that are delinquent on assessments and approximately 30 of them are one month delinquent. Another 17 owe less than the assessment amount ranging from \$219.32 to \$.30.

According to our Statement of Revenues & Expense, as of January 31, 2023 Actual monthly expense was \$128,599.40 vs Budget of \$133,177.32 for a difference of \$4,577.92. YTD numbers are the same as we have only one month of history for the year. (Note: 2023 Operating budget includes adding income of \$33,547 from Prior Year Surplus to balance our budget. This is reflected in our budget comparison as \$2,796 in income monthly and affects budget comparison results. The result is that our \$4,577.92 under budget result actually amounts to \$1,781.92) (\$4,577.92 - \$2,796 = \$1,781.92.)

Notable expenses during the month included Irrigation Repair of \$4,725 compared to budget of \$2,083.33; , Security access reader at Rec entrance \$1,008; clubhouse electrical work and light installation \$1,197; Gutter repairs \$2,555 compared to budget of \$333.33.

Our annual meeting and board election is coming up in March. Official notification and more detail will be included in your annual packet to be received around the first of March.

And don't forget, our monthly assessment amount changes to \$245.36 as of April 1st.

PARKING! DID YOU KNOW?

- Parking at the ends of streets is for guests only. Resident parking is available in the Clubhouse lot.
- Parking from 2AM -7AM requires a permit
- Speed limit is 15MPH
- At the end of your driveway is a flat curb called a "ribbon." The ribbon is not part of the driveway, and therefore, vehicles must be fully in the driveway and not over the ribbon.
- Trailers are prohibited in driveways, unless actively being loaded or unloaded. All unattached trailers must otherwise be parked at the rear of the Clubhouse lot, with a permit, if parking overnight.



Choices, Choices, So Many Choices

We mentioned several months ago in this space that there was a new LOW Approved Plant list being developed. Well, it is now on the Lake of the Woods HOA webpage (<u>Lake of the Woods, HOA</u> (<u>lakeofthewoodshoa.com</u>). On the home page, just click on Landscape and Approved Plant List then the plant list will open (<u>Ground Covers (lakeofthewoodshoa.com</u>). The list consists of links to various sources that include descriptions and pictures of the selected plant, care instructions and other general information. Happy gardening!!

It is highly probable that winter is over (Yay!!). Shortly, the blooming period for azaleas will also be over, so it will be a good time to prune them back. This can't wait until new buds come out. If the new buds get clipped, the shrubs will not bloom so well the next cycle. This warming time is also a good time to fertilize azaleas, palms, camelias and other ornamentals.

Bulbs (for instance, begonias, cannas, amaryllis – see the above-mentioned plant list for details) should be showing up at retailers in preparation for planting in March and April. Also showing up will be the little critters. Be careful when you buy plants and check that they aren't infested with, for instance, thripes and aphids.

This month the irrigation pump at the Fair Oaks well on the northside was replaced. That pump served LOW well since its installation in 1999. With that work, all the LOW irrigation pumps should be working to capacity. That is, if the irrigation heads in the field are intact. There are several work orders pending that will keep entire zones out of service. If you see a broken irrigation head around your unit, please submit a work order for it. We are trying to expedite repairs to get ready for the summer. Expect 2023 to be a hot year – **El Nino is coming back!!**

Up-Date from the Building & Grounds Committee!

The major projects that our Committee are working on at this time are moving forward. Surveyors have completed their survey work and the Board has Approved an Engineer to Draw the Scope of Work to complete the repairs.

Once the Scope is completed the Invitation to Bid this job will go out to a minimum of three (3) contractors. General rule here is to ask that the Scope be followed to the letter and the Bid should include "Cost." Bids will be analyzed, and a recommendation will be presented to the Board for Approval. This will take a little time but once the bids are reviewed and a Recommendation is made, this project will be ready to go! I must say, as Chair of this Committee this has been a real changing project. I will also say that this Committee is up to the task. Everyone has worked hard to get to this point. The Drainage / Water Intrusion project has been in the work for five (5) years now and this past year was the turning point! The Homeowners Had WATER into their Homes! The Board of Directors made the decision that this was the final limit and we Must move forward with the Project.

We completed one Intrusion site, as a test site! It worked and is still working. Once the Scope is written and the Contractor is selected, work will begin!

At this point we are in the process of updating our Specification for Improvements Homeowners wish to make to the Exterior of their Homes.

We now have three (3) Contractors who have agreed to accept business from the LOW Community and create the Iron Gates that are on our list as the four styles the new Gate must be. This is also good news. Names and contact information will be provided to the Office and we will be back in business.

We have also gotten a commitment from one of the Homeowners to be the Contractor for the Wood Gate. This information will be provided to the office as well.

This is meant as a "good piece of news'! Congratulations to the B&G Committee, for a job well done!

- If the bulk item(s) is not picked up on Friday, the bulk item(s) must be removed from the curb and brought back inside until an alternative, scheduled pick up time can be made.

No trash or bulk item(s) can be put out prior to 6p.m. the day before pick up.




JOIN US FOR YOGA AND SOUND HEALING?


